Blow the trumpet in Zion; sound the alarm on my holy mountain! Let all the inhabitants of the land tremble, for the day of the LORD is coming, it is near--a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and thick darkness! Like blackness spread upon the mountains a great and powerful army comes; their like has never been from of old, nor will be again after them in ages to come. Yet even now, says the LORD, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; rend your hearts and not your clothing. Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and relents from punishing. Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the LORD, your God? Blow the trumpet in Zion; sanctify a fast; call a solemn assembly; gather the people. Sanctify the congregation; assemble the aged; gather the children, even infants at the breast. Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her canopy. Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep. Let them say, "Spare your people, O LORD, and do not make your heritage a mockery, a byword among the nations. Why should it be said among the peoples, 'Where is their God?'" Joel 2:1-12 Lectionary: Ash Wednesday

This year the sacred season of Lent begins on March 9, 2011. On this day, Ash Wednesday, we begin a season of fasting and prayer. As a community of faith we will turn our hearts to God as we examine our lives and motives. This orienting to God helps us in our spiritual growth.

There are two common views of this season of Lent. Some believe that Lent is a time to sacrifice. Others use this season to feel sorry for past wrongs and then promise to do better. These cursory approaches to this holy season prevent us from fully accessing the promise of Lent. The first practice of giving up for the season becomes in effect a motivation for getting things done that we couldn't accomplish in other times of our lives. The "sacrificing" becomes a way to test our will power and strength of purpose. The second view focuses on our ability to provide a simple solution to fix the wrongs of our lives. But if we are able to simply fix our problems we could have solved our problems at other time of our lives. Both these approaches for Lent aren't successful in providing meaningful change or spiritual maturity because they rely too much on our own abilities.

Sacrifice as well as confessing and amending for past wrongs is admirable but are only the first steps in true spiritual growth. Spiritual maturity comes from the knowledge that no matter what we must rely on God to help us. The power of Lent to change our lives relies on our ability to turn to our Lord with all our heart.

Let me qualify this a bit. Offering our lives to God does not mean taking away our responsibility to do hard work. In fact offering our lives means putting ourselves in positions that allow God to help us change those habits that disempower us and replacing them with holy habits that strengthen us. One of the best ways to do this is to come to church. It is a holy habit to be in worship and prayer with a supportive, loving community. Please note that it is not by coincidence that when God wanted to remake a holy people out of the slaves of Egypt he formed them into a community. Nor is it by accident that when Jesus desired to establish the Kingdom of God he first formed a group of disciples. The communities established by God rooted in prayer and worship allow the power of God to help heal and renew those who open their lives to God.

My friends, in this sacred season of Lent may God grant you choicest blessings as you orient your spiritual lives to Him.

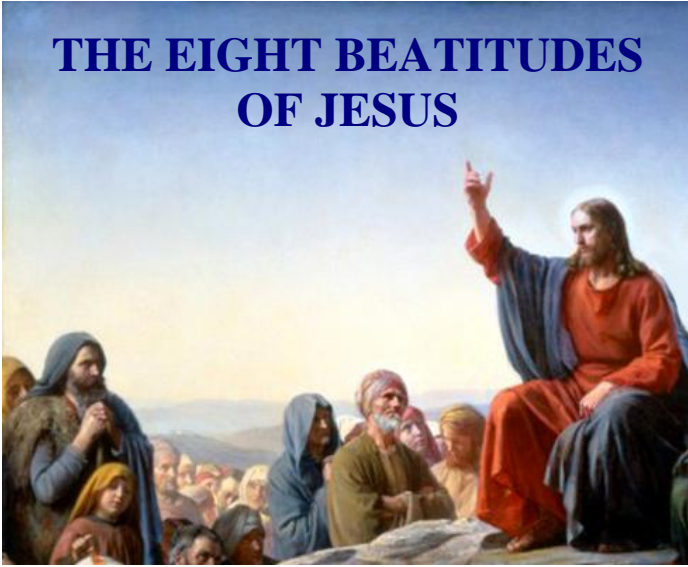

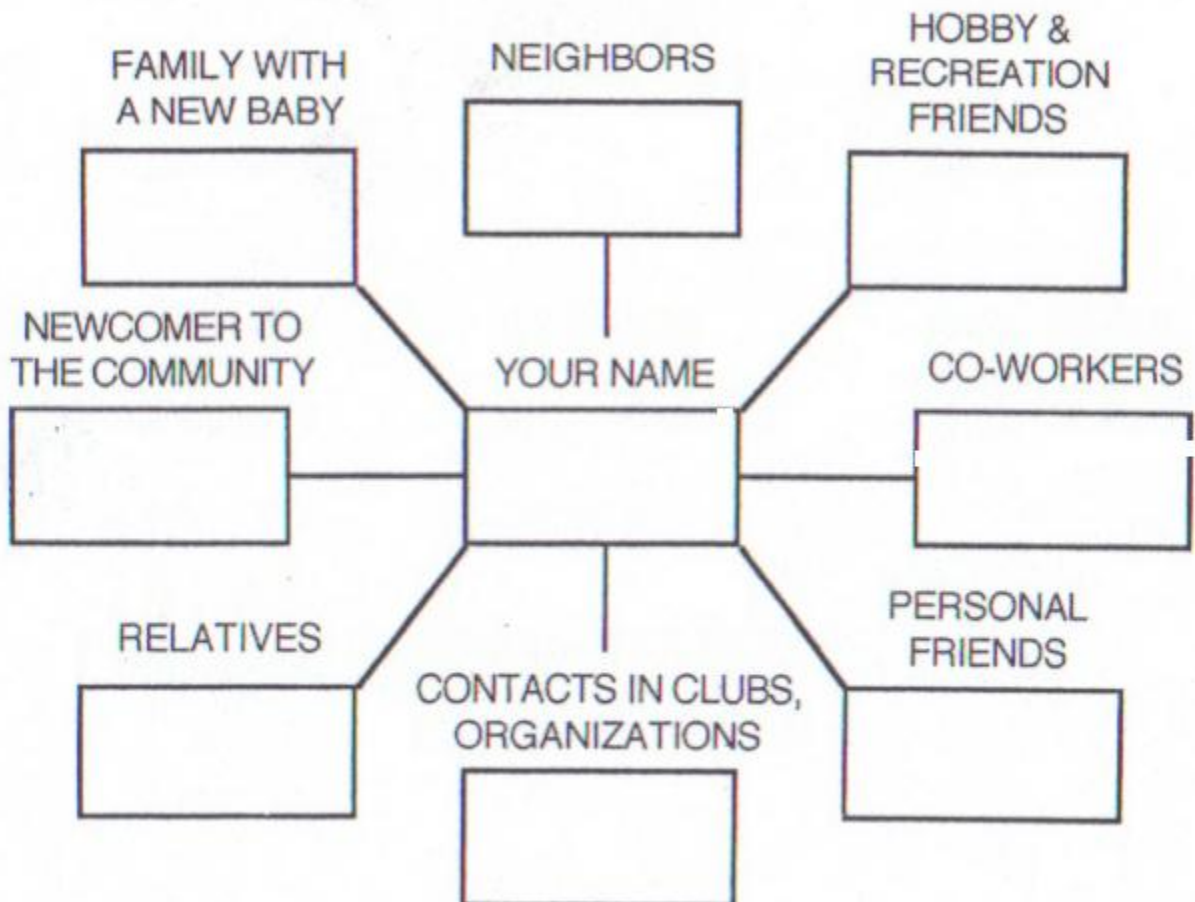

St. Vincent de Paul Society

Merry Mecellino, coordinator for St. Vincent volunteer activities, has provided information about the Society's assistance in addition to the food donations. (It is to be noted that the Society refers to those they help as guests. They are seeking volunteers for.



1. Home Visits
2. Advocates
3. Delivery Service.

HOME VISITS:

When a guest first comes to the Society they are interviewed and provided food, but they are informed that to be placed on the Food Maintenance Program a home visit is necessary before they can be eligible for food every two weeks. (They keep logs in the Center to keep track of each guest who receives food).

Home Visits are made by 2 volunteers either from 9:30 to 10:30 am or 7 to 8pm. A training program is given to each volunteer who always is accompanied with a mentor. The information concerning the family's income and expenses is then provided to the Society board members who meet every Tuesday at 7pm.

ADVOCATES:

Advocates assist the guests in filling out different forms and in navigating systems like the Welfare and Social Security Offices.

DELIVERY SERVICES:

Drivers are needed to deliver food to the homebound families, pick up food from the food bank and from other people and agencies who do food drives for the Society.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

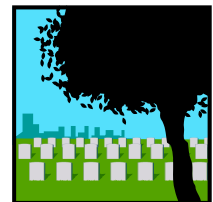
