## THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

The Celebrant blesses the water, first saying

Celebrant	Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
People	It is right to give him thanks and praise.

#### Celebrant

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Celebrant touches the water

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. Amen.

#### THE BAPTISM

#### BCP p. 307

Each candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant, who then immerses, or pours water upon, the candidate, saying

*Alyssa*, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.* 

When this action has been completed for all candidates, the Bishop or Priest, at a place in full sight of the congregation, prays over them, saying

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon Alyssa your *servant* the forgiveness of sin, and have raised *her* to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. Amen.

Then the Bishop or Priest places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross [using Chrism if desired] and saying to each one

Alyssa you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. Amen.

WELCOME THE NEWLY BAPTIZED When all have been baptized, the Celebrant says

Let us welcome the newly baptized.



#### Warden's House Gallery 150 High Street, Mount Holly

Completed in 1888, this house, which is attached to the Historic Prison Museum, once served as the warden's living quarters. It is the permanent home of the Hugh Campbell collection and highlights works by emerging artists.

Hugh H. Campbell was an artist, published author, and philosopher who lived an extremely minimalistic life right here in Mt. Holly. Much of his collection has been stored away, deep within Burlington County's archives. This exhibit will grant you a unique opportunity to view rare and never seen before art. The exhibit will feature paintings, sketches, pastel and chalk drawings, as well as early drawings of when Hugh began to learn and practice his art.

Hugh Campbell Collection: A Local Odyssey 2nd Floor Exhibit (ongoing) Hugh H. Campbell was a man of many talents. He expressly captured his own view of Mount Holly and surrounding areas through the self-taught use of his paintbrush. Sometimes called the "Van Gogh of Mount Holly" he painted voraciously and sold his canvases regularly along a wall on High Street. This shifting exhibit includes artifacts and selected works from the Hugh H. Campbell archives including newly acquired works!
